













Making Paper Windows

		
<p>1. Make several tight rolls of newspaper, secure with tape. Join enough rolls together end to end to make a long tube about 4 ft long.</p>	<p>2. Using a 12-inch (30cm) rule as a guide, make a square shape by bending the tube as shown and taping the ends together.</p>	<p>3. Tape another tube horizontally across the centre of the square.</p>
		
<p>4. This tube should be taped to the front of the square.</p>	<p>5. Flatten both ends of the tube and tape securely.</p>	<p>6. Tape another tube vertically across the centre of the square and tape the two cross tubes together at the centre.</p>
		
<p>7. Cut a piece of card (from a cereal box is good) the same size as the window frame, leaving a tab at the top of the card.</p>	<p>8. Attach another tab to the top tube of the window frame. Make a hole through both tabs to hang up the finished window.</p>	<p>9. Paint the window frame before attaching the backing card.</p>
		
<p>10. Fasten the backing card to the window frame by taping the sides and bottom only. Paint over the tape to match the frame.</p>	<p>11. The illustrated card should slip easily into the window frame without showing gaps at the sides or bottom.</p>	<p>12. Design a collection of your own pictures to make a changing display on the wall.</p>

Making Paper Windows

Make a window box full of colourful flowers.

		
<p>13. Make flowers from rolled up kitchen tissues fastened with tape. The stems are made from stiff wire covered with 'Artstraws', and petals are circles of coloured tissue.</p>	<p>14. A suitable sized box can be decorated and 'soil' is made from layers of kitchen tissue painted brown.</p>	<p>15. The wire flower stems are threaded through small holes in the box base and secured with tape.</p>
		
<p>16. The window box is fastened to the window frame using two plastic ties.</p>	<p>17. Make your own scene or use paper cut-outs from pats paper projects.</p>	<p>18. The completed window.</p>
